The Irrigation Association is now accepting abstracts for the Technical Sessions at the 2012 Irrigation Show and Education Conference taking place in Orlando, Fla. Nov. 2 - 6. There will be separate tracks for agricultural and landscape irrigation subjects. If interested, please follow the submission guidelines noted below.

Submission of Abstracts

For consideration as a presenter, your 150-word abstract must be submitted online beginning Feb.7; all submissions must be received by April 4, 2012. IA reserves the right to limit accepted papers to one per author; acceptance is not guaranteed.

Your abstract must include concise descriptive content that explains the value of the information. Papers and presentations must be non-proprietary and educational in nature, not sales or product specific. They may include research, programs and case studies. Papers must be presented in English; translators are not permitted.

Presenters will be selected and notified the week of May 14. Upon acceptance, each speaker will be required to submit a \$250 publishing fee, as well as a complete written paper, by Oct. 2, 2012, for inclusion in the proceedings CD. IA will retain \$50 of the publishing fee and reimburse the remaining \$200 following the presentation of your paper at the conference in Orlando. Should you fail to submit a written paper and/or present your paper in Orlando, IA will retain the entire \$250.

As a benefit, one presenting author will receive a complimentary full registration to the show, which includes access to the exhibits, technical sessions, seminars, General Session and keynote address, and a copy of the 2012 conference proceedings CD. Travel and hotel expenses will be your responsibility.

If your abstract is selected for publication, IA holds all rights, title, and interest in the paper submitted to the collection web site. In turn, IA hereby grants to the author a nonexclusive, royalty-free license to use, reproduce and distribute the paper including the right to sublicense the copyright in the published article, provided that each copy shall include IA copyright notice on the reproduction or distributed copy.
